
Daily Laboratory-Confirmed COVID-19 Cases, 19 Feb - 18 August 2020




Daily confirmed COVID-19 Deaths, 19 Feb - 18 August 2020



COVID-19 Cumulative Laboratory-Confirmed Cases and Recoveries, 19 Feb - 18 August 2020




COVID-19 Patients in Intensive Care, 26 Mar - 18 August 2020





Total Number of Daily COVID-19 PCR Tests









Currently Iraqis with tourism and pilgrimage purposes are not allowed to enter Iran. Travelers are required to have valid health certificates indicating negative Coronavirus test. In addition, their passport numbers must have been printed in their health certificates. The Embassy of Iran also announced that among the Iranians, only diplomats are currently allowed to enter Iraq. Iraq resumed international flights for passengers under strict health guidelines. Wearing masks and hand gloves and social distancing in the Airports is mandatory for all workers and passengers.</p> <p>Passengers traveling to Basra (BSR) and Baghdad (BGW) must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) test result issued at most 48 hours before departure. Passengers transiting through Basra (BSR) must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) test result issued at most 72 hours before departure.</p> <p>The body temperature of all passengers will be checked by thermal camera screening at the terminal entrance. Passengers are also subject to medical screening and quarantine. Passengers arriving at Erbil (EBL) or Sulaymaniyah (ISU) must complete a "Pledge Form" upon arrival. Departing Passengers are required to carry out PCR test at the medical centers and health laboratories specified by Iraq Ministry of Health and according to the requirements of the states of destination, in case destination state didn't request (PCR) test, so it must be done before 72 hours from departure flight date.</p> <p>Mehran border - operational on Sundays and Wednesdays allowing the daily transport of 250 trucks. Health protocols are strictly followed on Mehran crossing. Negotiations are still ongoing for full reopening of the Mehran border. All entrants to Iraq from this border point must have a health certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) test result.</p> <p>Shalamcheh – currently is operational for two days per week on Saturdays and Wednesdays.</p> <p>Chazabeh – currently is operational only for cargo export from Iran to Iraq.</p> <p>Bashmagh-Marivan - export and transit is operational through this border.</p> <p>Khosravi – reopened on 23 July 2020 for cargo transit. Currently the border point is open for individual passenger traffic with full compliance of health protocols. Effective 12 August 2020, cargo transit became operational on all weekdays.</p> <p>Parviz Khan - reopened on Monday 25 May 2020.</p> <p>Tamarchin – export and transit is operational through this border.</p> <p>Soumar (Mandali) – reopened on 11 July 2020. Currently the border point is operational on Sundays and Wednesdays.</p>

Travel Restrictions Imposed by Iran

Effective from 5 August 2020, all arriving passengers at all Iranian air borders are required to present a completed self-declaration health form (Covid-19 Screening Form) and Passengers' Commitment Form provided by the air operators, together with a health certificate (for passengers above two years-old) issued in English by appropriate health authorities in the departure country indicating negative PCR test result issued at most 96 hours before departure.

Should the health certificate not be presented on arrival, international passenger will not be permitted to enter Iran and Iranian nationals will be tested and quarantined for 48 hours until they receive the test result. In case of positive test result, the passenger is required to self-quarantine for 14 days or will be referred to medical centers. Passengers shall incur all the expenses including medical tests and accommodation.

All arriving passengers are subject to screening and suspicious national passengers will be tested again and quarantined for 48 hours until they receive the test result. International suspicious passengers will be also tested again and quarantined for 48 hours until they receive the test result. In case of positive test result, international passengers will be quarantined in assigned locations by MoH Iran for 14 days or will be referred to medical centers. Passengers shall incur all the expenses including medical tests and accommodation.

Wearing masks at all passenger terminals of Iran airports is mandatory.

Passenger are strongly advised to cross check with their air operators on the latest prerequisites and required documentations.

Imam Khomeini International Airport (IKIA) office can be reached at +9821 5100111 regarding the issues related to health regulations both for incoming and outgoing flights. IKIA is also equipped with three disinfecting machines for passengers and baggage as a measure to prevent the spread of coronavirus at the airport.

International Airlines

Qatar Airways: Currently operates two daily flights in the rout of Doha-Tehran as per the below schedule.

All Doha terminating passengers are being quarantined for 14 days. For transfer passengers, no health certificate is required; however, all transfer passengers are being screened before they board their onward flight. In addition, all terminals of Hamad International Airport are equipped with Thermal screening cameras.

Effective 18 August, Qatar Airways requires passengers travelling from specific countries including Iran to present a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR medical test result when checking in. Tests must be issued within 72 hours before departure, from laboratories that are approved by Qatar Airways, and paid for at the passenger's expense. Those that do not have a copy of their medical test certificate alongside a Passenger Consent Form will not be permitted to travel on Qatar Airways flights. Infants are exempted from PCR test requirements. Children below the

age of 12 years are exempt from this test if accompanied by family members that have presented a negative test result. Children under 12 years traveling as Unaccompanied Minor are not exempted and must hold certificate of proof from the authorized medical center. Passengers must possess two copies of the test result and must fill and submit a consent form along with the RT-PCR test result. National Airlines

Iran Air: Currently operates three weekly flights to London on Sundays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, two weekly flights to Paris on Mondays and Fridays, one weekly flight to Amsterdam on Thursdays, one weekly flight to Milan on Fridays and one weekly flight to Manchester every Saturday. Only the passengers with European residency card, Type D visa holders and long-term visa holders can embark on these flights. In addition, Iran Air operates extra flights to Madrid, Karachi and Minsk for the purpose of returning Iranians only. Following health screening at Imam Khomeini International Airport, passengers are being provided with the required Health certificate for international flights.

Effective from 8 August 2020, Iran Air operates weekly flights to Kuwait. As scheduled, on Saturdays one flight from Isfahan to Kuwait City and the return flight and on Wednesdays, one flight from Shiraz to Kuwait City and the return flight, will be operated.

Passengers will be tested again for COVID-19 upon arrival in Guangzhou airport and are subject to quarantine for 14 days. Currently some other national airlines such as **Taban, Zagros, Iran Airtour, Iran Aseman, Qeshm airlines** and **Kish Air** are also operating some conditional flights mainly in the route of Istanbul and Dubai for returning Iranians.
